ONE of the most important skills a chiropractor needs to develop is the ability to **find** nerve pressure—to **find** it exactly, specifically, where it is on each patient.

IMPORTANT as it is, the skill of finding nerve pressure is too often sadly underdeveloped and even neglected. This is probably a result of an over-reliance on some of the other tools of the trade, allowing them to dictate rather than confirm the location of the subluxation. One evidence of this can be found on post x-ray films that reveal no improvements, no changes, after the first few adjustments. This is a reliable indication that the real spinal problem is still there—yet undetected and uncorrected. It shows that compensations were adjusted while subluxations were overlooked.

ADEPTNESS in the art of palpation, motion palpation, concussion, visualization for fluid infiltration, and instrumentation, is a requirement in order to **find** a subluxation. There is no easy, quick solution. There is no shortcut. Nothing

less than all of these factors combined will accurately tell you where to find nerve pressure. (Notice, x-rays are left out of this list. That is because the x-ray films do not show nerve pressure. They are meant to show position of vertebrae for the purpose of correction.)

THE SKILLS of finding nerve pressure as well as the skills of correcting nerve pressure are taught in detail both on a basic level for beginners in Gonstead work and on an advanced level.

IF YOU want to make changes, improvements, corrections in your patients' spines, if you want to be certain you are finding and correcting nerve pressure and not just adjusting what look to be the most grossly misaligned vertebrae, if you want to be sure of your science, attend a Gonstead Seminar.
